

Easy math problems for kids 6

You enter a number from 1 to 9 in the squares, but numbers can only be used once.

1. $\boxed{7} \times \boxed{6} \div \boxed{2} + \boxed{5} - \boxed{} = 17$

2. $\boxed{3} \times \boxed{5} \div \boxed{1} + \boxed{} - \boxed{9} = 12$

3. $\boxed{9} \times \boxed{5} \div \boxed{} + \boxed{6} - \boxed{1} = 20$

4. $\boxed{5} \times \boxed{} \div \boxed{2} + \boxed{6} - \boxed{3} = 13$

5. $\boxed{} \times \boxed{4} \div \boxed{1} + \boxed{9} - \boxed{3} = 38$

6. $\boxed{9} \times \boxed{2} \div \boxed{1} + \boxed{5} - \boxed{} = 17$

7. $\boxed{2} \times \boxed{6} \div \boxed{3} + \boxed{} - \boxed{4} = 7$

8. $\boxed{9} \times \boxed{8} \div \boxed{} + \boxed{1} - \boxed{4} = 21$

9. $\boxed{9} \times \boxed{} \div \boxed{3} + \boxed{8} - \boxed{4} = 25$

10. $\boxed{} \times \boxed{3} \div \boxed{1} + \boxed{6} - \boxed{2} = 25$

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Results:

1. $7 \times 6 \div 2 + 5 - 9 = 17$

2. $3 \times 5 \div 1 + 6 - 9 = 12$

3. $9 \times 5 \div 3 + 6 - 1 = 20$

4. $5 \times 4 \div 2 + 6 - 3 = 13$

5. $8 \times 4 \div 1 + 9 - 3 = 38$

6. $9 \times 2 \div 1 + 5 - 6 = 17$

7. $2 \times 6 \div 3 + 7 - 4 = 7$

8. $9 \times 8 \div 3 + 1 - 4 = 21$

9. $9 \times 7 \div 3 + 8 - 4 = 25$

10. $7 \times 3 \div 1 + 6 - 2 = 25$
